Clerk's Report: Communion was served to 73 communicants on Sunday, December 4, 2022.

Donna Yeisley submitted a letter requesting that she be removed from the church rolls as of December 31, 2022, but remain a friend of the church until they find a new church in the area where they have moved.

**Treasurer's Report:** The treasurer's report was distributed and discussed by the Session.

#### **Session Team Reports (Chair)**

Finance & Stewardship (Barry Gaut): The Presbytery of Huntingdon, at its September 27, 2022, meeting, approved a per capita rate for 2023 of \$39.24 per member. This will be an increase of \$4.99 over the 2022 per capita rate.
