(Note: The following highlights are taken from the minutes of the Monday, March 20, 2023, regular Session meeting.)

Clerk's Report: Communion was served to 67 communicants on Sunday, March 5, 2023.

Treasurer's Report: The treasurer's report was distributed and discussed by the Session.

Huntingdon Presbytery Report: The next meeting of Huntingdon Presbytery will be held on Saturday, March 25 2023, and will be a Zoom meeting. Mark Leberfinger will be our Session representative.

Session Team Reports (Chair)

Finance & Stewardship (Barry Gaut): Per Capita for 2023 has been established at \$39.24 per person, and based on 139 members, our per capita bill from Huntingdon Presbytery will be \$5,454.36, which is payable in quarterly installments.

For the period ending on February 28, 2023, a total of \$2,199.92 has been paid to our per capita fund. This represents a 40% response, or approximately 56 of our 139 members.

Our committee has received a proposal for a 2024 stewardship program from KLW Enterprises which we are in the process of evaluating. We have used KLW materials in the past and the cost of their proposal for 2024 falls within our budget should we decide to use it.

Congregational Fellowship (Glenn Nelson): The church picnic is scheduled for Sunday, July 23, at DelGrosso's Park. Our cost for meals is \$13 per person and a ride pass is \$24.95. The committee will discuss what to charge for meals and a ride pass at a later date. DelGrosso's has gone to a cashless system which means credit cards will be necessary for in-park purchases.

There will be no coffee fellowship in April since an Easter egg hunt will be held after church on the first Sunday of the month (Palm Sunday), April 2.

Glenn thanked Kathy Braun and Nancy Nevling for doing a good job with the March coffee fellowship.

A potluck covered dish lunch is planned for Sunday, May 7. This will take the place of our regular coffee fellowship for May.

Jane Falco will order 30 tickets for the Altoona Curve game on Thursday, July 20. The men of the church will be singing at that game.

Mission (Mark Leberfinger): A thank-you note was received from Family Services, and a newsletter was received from the Breezewood Trucker and Traveler Ministry—both are supported by our church.

This month we gave the following: Unified Mission, \$1,000; World Mission, \$500.

At least two youth from the congregation plan on attending Camp Krislund this summer.

For the Altoona Food Bank in April, we are asking for donations of canned fruit. In addition, any donation of nonperishable food is appreciated.

Sometime after Easter, we will be taking up an offering for the Asian Christian Academy in India, a ministry that we learned about from Carol Adams. The offering will be designated for clothing and blankets for children in need at the Academy, which is located in Tamil Nadu.

At our Soup on Saturday event in April, we will be moving indoors. We are asking for volunteers to bring soup and desserts with the Mission Team purchasing the sandwiches and hot and cold beverages for the event. The time for Soup on Saturday will be from 11:30 am until 1:00 pm.

Fifty-four lunches were served at the February Soup on Saturday event, the remainder were distributed to local shelters.

There will be minute for missions presented in late March and April for the One Great Hour of Sharing.

Outreach (Jane Yerty): There were 19 adults and one child signed up for the Card Making event on Thursday, March 9. The committee is happy to report that nine of these attendees were guests or new friends.

Plans are continuing for our Yard Sale on Saturday, April 22, from 8:00 am until 12:00 pm. Proceeds will benefit Krislund scholarships for neighborhood children. We will ask for donations from the church to help with these scholarships if the yard sale does not produce enough funds. Tables for this sale will be up on Monday, April 17. Volunteer help for the set-up and day of the sale would be greatly appreciated.

The church's movie license was paid for from the Outreach and Spiritual Enhancement committees. Thank you.

Save the date for the Parking Lot Party on Saturday, July 22, 2023.

Installation of the garden beds will take place soon—details to come and assistance is welcome.

Property (Geoff Geesey): The committee is still waiting to hear from the roofers and from the architect who is going to advise us on the installation of a stair lift.

There will be a "Phil Hall" workday on Saturday, April 29.

Spiritual Enhancement (Jeanie Mollica): There will be no youth Sunday school on April 9, (Easter Sunday).

This year's Vacation Bible School is scheduled for Sunday, August 6, through Thursday, August 10.

Worship (Ellie Herbster): Glenn Nelson will be our liturgist in March, Mark Leberfinger will be the liturgist in April, and Gaylend Young will be the liturgist in May. Dave Brownell and Geoff Geesey will be the greeters for March.

The next Readers' Theatre will be on Sunday, April 2, and will possibly include children.

Emergency Day Protocol phone service: Ellie Herbster is continuing to investigate. Our church will use a pay-as-you-go service. We will need to get one contact number from each individual or family. If a test is needed, we might just use committee members to do this. For now, the Worship Team will make all calls in the event that we would need to contact everyone.

Easter flower order forms have been inserted into the bulletins. Palms have been ordered for the youth to carry; 100 palm crosses have also been ordered. There are two small pots of artificial palms downstairs that we can use for the Palm Sunday service.

Extinguishing the Lenten candles is being done by the different readers each Sunday. Pastor Braun is recruiting the readers.

Church Lenten Calendar:

- April 2, Palm Sunday Procession with youth carrying the palms. (No communion.)
- April 6, Maundy Thursday Service will be at 7:00 pm. Communion will be observed. The communion table will be stripped and the Christ Candle extinguished. The sanctuary will be darkened; 33 chimes will be played and everyone will exit the church in silence.
- April 7, Good Friday service will be at the Hollidaysburg Presbyterian Church at 7:00 pm. There will be a combined choir.
- April 9, Easter Sunday There will be no Sunday school, but the Adult Sunday school class will offer a continental breakfast at 9:30 am. A Community Sunrise Service at the Wopsononock

Mountain overlook at a time to be determined. The Easter service at Providence Presbyterian Church will be at 10:15 am.

June 4, Trinity Sunday. We may switch to our "summer schedule" on that Sunday and we are looking into having an outside service.

Our committee is checking into the possibility of using family liturgists during the summer months.

Our church organ is old and there are some parts on it that are in need of repair. Session agreed to spend \$400 to perform some immediate repairs and also learn what major issues need to be addressed. The Worship Committee will discuss establishing an ad hoc organ committee to investigate the next steps that need to be taken with the organ.
