(Note: The following highlights are taken from the minutes of the Monday, July 17, 2023, regular Session meeting.)

Clerk's Report: Sixty-nine communicants received communion on Sunday, July 2.

Treasurer's Report: The treasurer's report was distributed and discussed.

Huntingdon Presbytery Report: Presbytery ratified the agreement between Providence Presbyterian Church and Pastor Dennis Braun to dissolve their pastoral relationship effective August 31, 2023, so that Pastor Braun can retire. There are now 38 congregations in Huntingdon Presbytery with only 12 of those having full-time installed pastors.

Nominating Committee Report (Barry Gaut and Ellie Herbster): The committee is working with a list of 16 names suggested to be on our Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC). The group will now begin making contacts to see who is willing to serve on the PNC.

Moderator's Report: Dennis McGeary, Wesley Thompson, and Devany Laratonda will become active members of Providence Presbyterian Church. Kai Thompson and Oakley Thompson will be baptized at Providence in the near future.

Pastor Braun reviewed the "Code of Conduct for Former Pastors" with the Session to explain why he is not permitted to associate with our church for a designated period of time. Session accepted the provisions of this document and our clerk signed the agreement on behalf of the Session.

Session Team Reports (Chair)

Finance & Stewardship (Barry Gaut): Per capita for 2023 has been established at \$39.24 per member,

and based on 139 members, our per capita bill from Huntingdon Presbytery will be \$5,454.36, which we pay in four installments of \$1,363.59. For the period ending on June 30, 2023, a total of \$3,116.50 has been paid to our per capita fund. This represents a 57% response.

Congregational Care (Gail Irwin): Coupons for military families will be sent at the end of July.

Homebound communion is scheduled for the months of August and November.

Congregational Fellowship (Glenn Nelson): The committee has received 43 reservations for the church picnic. The church group attending the Altoona Curve baseball game will do so on Thursday, July 20.

Mission (Judy Hartzell) : We distributed 51 lunches at our Soup on Saturday event in July; leftovers were delivered to the Altoona Teen Shelter.

A suggestion was made that we place a flyer in the box in the Community Garden and the Food Pantry regarding a way to contact the Facebook page of the Blair County Narcan Squad. Judy will invite the person in charge of that organization to come and speak to us on either Sunday, August 13 or 20.

Outreach (Jane Yerty): We are very blessed to be sending five neighborhood children to Krislund. The response from those who have attended is overwhelmingly positive. We are working to keep these young people and their families engaged in church activities.

Our thanks to Jen Braun for helping us to resolve

issues with email contacts from the Yard Sale. We plan to spread the news of upcoming activities at Providence Church using those contacts.

The Community Library is up and running. We are asking for donations of books suitable for adults (we have an adequate supply for teens and children).

Community Garden Update—Everything is growing, including the weeds and grass. We are scheduling work days as needed. Nancy Woomer and Bruce Hazlett continue to take a much appreciated leadership role. Thank you to those who are faithfully filling the water tanks.

The team is planning a card making event for September or October. These cards will be geared toward giving to veterans. More details will be shared as the planning develops.

Property (Geoff Geesey): Geoff has spoken with a representative from Cumberland Glass. He will be at the church this week to inspect the stained glass vent windows in the sanctuary. [At a special Session meeting on Sunday, July 30, Session approved the repair of all the bottom vent windows in the sanctuary by Cumberland Glass. Money for the repairs will be taken from our Stained Glass Window Fund.—Ed.]

Spiritual Enhancement (Jeanie Mollica): The team is ready for this year's Vacation Bible School, which will be held from Sunday, August 6, through Thursday, August 10.

We are discussing Sunday school curriculum for the fall of this year.

Worship (Ellie Herbster): Acolytes, liturgists, and ushers are mostly set for July.

The pipe organ is repaired for now, but we're not sure how long the repairs will hold. The organ has been made from parts which are no longer available. A digital replacement organ would probably be the way to go, but the committee has not yet made a decision.

On Sunday, July 23, we will have a casual morning worship service. An announcement will be made to wear your picnic clothes to the service.

For Reader's Theatre, Rick Herbster will make some

copies of the script for reading at the next meeting.

Session remained after our regular meeting to work on the remainder of the 2023 Mission Study.

(Note: The following highlights are taken from the minutes of the Monday, August 21, 2023, regular Session meeting.)

Clerk's Report: Cora Nelson passed away on Sunday, August 20, 2023.

Fifty-five communicants received communion on Sunday, August 6.

Devany Laratonda and Wesley Thompson were received into membership at Providence on Sunday, August 13. They were also baptized on that day with Kai and Oakley Thompson.

Treasurer's Report: The treasurer's report was distributed and discussed.

Nominating Committee: The committee has assembled the five member Pastor Nominating Committee along with one alternate. They are

continuing to search for a church treasurer and a Session position for the Finance and Stewardship Committee. Our current treasurer, Jane Carothers, is retiring as of the end of this year.

Moderator's Report: Pastor Braun is giving Kimberly ten gift cards for the benevolence fund and will surrender the checkbook to her also. A question was raised as to who will oversee these gift cards following Pastor Braun's retirement. It was suggested that Kimberly keep track of them and provide a report for our Session meetings. We asked Kimberly to have the person requesting a card sign for it and also to check with Session before giving out anything other than a gift card. Bob Hollingsworth said that he would meet with Kimberly on a regular basis to make sure that everything is going smoothly.

Huntingdon Presbytery's Committee on Ministry announced that our Moderator will be the Rev. Janie McElwee Smith. Rev. Mary Morrow is the probable liaison between the Committee on Ministry and our newly formed Pastor Nominating Committee.

Session Team Reports (Chair)

Finance & Stewardship (Barry Gaut): Per capita for 2023 has been established at \$39.24 per member, and based on 139 members, our per capita bill from Huntingdon Presbytery will be \$5,454.36, which we pay in four installments of \$1,363.59. For the period ending on July 30, 2023, a total of \$3,116.50. This amount is unchanged from what was reported as of June 30, 2023.

Jane Carothers and Barry Gaut recently met with Irwin Financial to discuss the church's manse account. This account was set up many years ago with the sale of the former Broad Avenue church's manse. Today, this account functions primarily as a small source of income for our church. As such, Irwin Financial suggested that a couple of funds be changed to realize more income. These funds are conservative in nature and within the current family of funds and would not involve any fees in their implementation. Session approved a motion to make these recommended changes.

The Finance and Stewardship Committee has recently received the materials from KLW Enterprises for the 2024 stewardship program. The theme for this program is "Working Together—Celebrating God's Good Gifts." Stewardship Sunday will be observed on November 5, 2023. A stewardship letter and estimate of giving card will be mailed to the congregation in October.

Congregational Care (Gail Irwin): Communion was delivered to the sick and shut-ins.

Congregational Fellowship (Glenn Nelson): Plans were made for a coffee fellowship on Sunday, August 27. There will not be a coffee fellowship in September.

Mission (Judy Hartzell) : We distributed 88 lunches at our Soup on Saturday event in August.

Pam Townsend, from Hope Drop-In, will be working on additional ways that our church could help the Families United for Change to expand the information about distribution of Narcan.

For July, our committee made the following donations: Partnership Presbyterian Fund - \$300; Pahk 5 Nan Special Projects - \$300; Pahk 5 Nan Partnership - \$300; Lexington Clubhouse - \$400; and Operation Our Town - \$150. August donations included: Altoona Food Bank - \$600; Friends of Kenya - \$700; and The Door - \$300.

For September, the Altoona Food Bank is asking for donations of cereal, especially children's cereal, although any non-perishable food is appreciated.

For our outdoor Food Pantry, we are asking for donations of non-perishable food items and personal care items. **Outreach (Jane Yerty):** We are going to have a card-making class on Wednesday, October 11.

Property (Geoff Geesey): Monitronics inspected our church's fire security system and reported that it is no longer operable. They proposed a new system for \$3,066.71, and would need a down payment of \$1,533.36 to start the work. Session approved the installation of this new system.

The pipe organ committee has spoken to an organ consultant, Mr. Zamberlan, and he is willing to travel to our church and inspect our organ. He will then send a detailed report on its condition, along with a recommendation to repair or replace. His fee for this work is \$750 plus expenses. He is scheduled to be here on Thursday, August 24.

Our outdoor electronic sign is not working. Kimberly will make arrangements for the repair.

Spiritual Enhancement (Jeanie Mollica): There will be a Bingo Party for the youth on Friday, September 8, from 6:00 pm until 9:00 pm.

Rally Day is on Sunday, September 10, and Sunday School resumes on September 17. All curriculum materials have been ordered.

Worship (Ellie Herbster): Acolytes, liturgists, and ushers are mostly set for August.

Rick Herbster clarified that if there is a question from any of the people on Pulpit Supply, those questions should be directed to the Worship Team.

The July 23 casual worship service was well received.


A motion was approved to elect the above to the 2023 Pastor Nominating Committee.

◆ This year marks the 40th anniversary of *Peacemaking: The Believers Calling* approved by the 192nd General Assembly (1980).

◆ World Communion Sunday is the most common Sunday for receiving the offering, but many congregations promote the Offering throughout *A Season of Peace* (September 3 - October 1).

◆ 25% of this Offering stays with our local congregation to support peacemaking and reconciliation in our community.

◆ 25% of the Offering goes to our mid council to join with other congregations to support peacemaking work in our region.

◆ 50% of this Offering supports the work for peace and reconciliation being done by Presbyterians across the globe.
