(Note: The following highlights are taken from the minutes of the Monday, September 18, 2023, regular Session meeting.)

Pastor Nominating Committee Report: Mary Morrow, Huntingdon Presbytery liaison, gave the Session a rundown on her position with our newlyformed Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC). She told the board that a Church Profile and a Pastor Profile will have to be written. Our Finance & Stewardship Committee will have to formulate figures for the terms of call. Session will need to establish what level of experience is required and set a budget for the PNC. Our church website will need to be reviewed so that it accurately reflects our church.

Clerk's Report: Lois McLaughlin passed away on September 9, 2023.

Treasurer's Report: The treasurer's report was distributed and discussed.

Huntingdon Presbytery Report: The next meeting will be held on Saturday, September 30, at Krislund Camp. We need to elect a commissioner to represent our church. Session will consider who to call and the clerk will get confirmation via email.

Nominating Committee Report: The committee is looking for a new church treasurer and an elder to

be on the Finance & Stewardship Committee. Information concerning both positions was given to committee members.

Moderator's Report: Pastor Janie McElwee-Smith is our moderator and she introduced herself to our Session. She is the current pastor at Hollidaysburg Presbyterian Church.

Session Team Reports (Chair)

Finance & Stewardship (Barry Gaut): The 2023 per capita amount has been established at \$39.24. For the period ending on August 30, 2023, there was \$3,551.18 given to our per capita fund. This represents a 65 percent (65%) response.

The letter, brochure, and the estimate of giving card for our 2024 stewardship program will be forwarded to Kimberly for duplication prior to mailing. Our plan is to have them in the mail by early October. Stewardship Sunday will be observed on November 5, 2023.

Congregational Care (Gail Irwin): Coupons were mailed on August 4, 2023, at a cost of \$17.10.

Cakes will be delivered to the Presbyterian Village at Hollidaysburg on Friday, September 29. Team members will meet at the church parking lot at 10:30 am on that day to make the delivery.

Dee Schnarrs will prepare "Thinking of You" and "Miss You" greeting cards in November.

The last shut-in communion for 2023 is scheduled for November. Kimberly will contact our homebound members to set up visits.

Our team discussed asking retired pastor Kathy Colebank to serve communion to our sick and shutin members. Pastor Janie, our new moderator, will prepare instructions for our team when serving communion in pairs when there is no pastor to assist them.

Congregational Fellowship (Glenn Nelson): The next coffee fellowship will be held on Sunday, October 1, with a fall theme. We will serve apple crisps and ice cream and the food will be prepared and baked during the worship service.

Mission (Judy Hartzell): Pam Townsend, from the Hope Drop-In Center, visited our meeting to explain the mission of their organization, which is primarily a homeless outreach. They provide food boxes and hot meals, supply clothing and hygiene products, connect individuals with mental health and substance abuse services, connect with services to provide temporary shelter and housing assistance, offer free laundry service, and assist with furniture and other items. The Center holds two Bible studies a week. Pam, an ordained minister, shared her mission with our team for about 30 minutes. We would like to invite her to speak at a worship service before the end of the year.

Following our Soup on Saturday event in August, we revised our *Altoona Mirror* announcement to include the statement, "We will be handing out one bag lunch per person."

NARCAN signs were placed on the outdoor pantry. There are three more signs which will be placed in the garden/alley area; perhaps a message can be added to our electronic sign on the corner of Broad Avenue and 24th Street.

The team received thank-you messages for donations to the Altoona Food Bank and the Operation Our Town organizations.

An announcement will be placed in the October

newsletter regarding Pastor Chuck Monts' missionary visit to Malawi.

The Mission Team removed the *Partnership with the Presbytery Fund* from our support list as the recipient is now a corporate business.

This month we gave the following: Mountain Lion Backpack Program - \$500; Altoona Food Bank -\$500; Hope Drop-In Center - \$500.

For the September Soup on Saturday event, we served 22 meals inside and 50 meals outside. Leftovers were sent to the Altoona Teen Shelter. It was decided that all meals will be served inside.

In September, we are asking for donations of canned soup and saltine crackers for the Altoona Food Bank. In addition, any donation of nonperishable food is greatly appreciated. For the outside Food Pantry, donations of cereals and personal care items are requested.

Outreach (Jane Yerty): The team agreed to keep their budget the same for 2024.

Boards for the garden have been purchased and are being painted. A big thanks to everyone who has helped with filling the water tanks this year. The garden will close at the end of October.

The Outreach Team is planning a card making event for Wednesday, October 11, at 1:00 pm, with Carol Adams and Kathy Braun. The theme for this get together is Veteran's cards, and our card creations will be provided to the Veterans Home. You are encouraged to attend and to bring a neighbor or friend since this is an outreach event. We plan on providing an informational flyer to our Soup on Saturday participants.

We discussed the need for transportation for Brenda Roberto, who currently has six foster children. Her vehicle can only hold four passengers and she would very much like to bring them to Sunday school and morning worship. This is a work in progress; Peggy Horner will help and we will see how this works out.

We are delighted to celebrate the success of the Krislund campers and want to build on the interest the young people and their families are showing with our church. To that end, we would like to offer Outreach's assistance to your Youth Department. Also consider fundraising throughout the year to have adequate monies to assist with Krislund Camp scholarships.

Our Community Library will continue through the end of October.

The Outreach Team would like all gardens cleaned out by the end of October. They have scheduled a workday for Saturday, October 21, from 8:00 am until 11:00 am. Any assistance is appreciated. The rain date for this workday will be October 28. Flyers will be sent to the community members who have gardens and bulletin announcements will be made for our church family.

Personnel (Bob Hollingsworth): Our former pastor's email address is still active. We will change the password, then forward all emails to Kimberly so that she can pass them on to the appropriate person. Requests for Session will be handled through our Session clerk.

Property (Geoff Geesey): We are purchasing a new string trimmer to replace the one that recently broke. The cost is approximately \$140.

Property anticipates that the new church office screen door will be installed in November.

Stained-glass vent window repairs in the sanctuary are scheduled for February/March 2024.

The 25th Street side sanctuary monitor failed, and owing to their age, both monitors will be replaced with larger 75-inch screens.

In the process of updating our fire alarm security panel, the Altoona City Code department is requesting a digital computer drawing of the church. We contacted the architect who helped us with our heating system for such a file and we hope that she can assist us with that request.

Spiritual Enhancement (Jeanie Mollica): There were 25 youth and 6 adults at our Bingo event on Friday, September 8.

Our team sent a check in the amount of \$665 to the Linus Project. We will be delivering blankets on Friday, September 22.

Sunday school teachers are in place for the coming year.

Upcoming Youth Events: JB Tree Farm on Saturday, October 14. Cost will be \$5 per person, with the church covering \$7 and providing food. Friendsgiving/Lock-In - All youth and their families will be invited for the dinner. Youth ages 9 and up will stay for a sleep-over. Caroling at the Presbyterian Village at Hollidaysburg - December date to be determined.

Other Ideas: Bowling/Ice Skating; Paint Party; Battle of the Brownies (Cooking competition); Trunk or Treat - Sunday, October 22, from 3:00 pm until 5:00 pm.

The Christmas Parade will be held on Saturday, December 2, at 1:00 pm. Our youth will vote on the theme

Mission Project Ideas - The youth will be discussing and choosing a mission project.

Our youth will be helping with the December 16 Soup on Saturday event. They will be making a take-home gift to give away in November.

Worship (Ellie Herbster): Acolytes, liturgists, and ushers are mostly set for September. Rick Herbster will be the liturgist for October.

We reviewed the pulpit supply list and discussed a checklist for the minister and liturgist.

Readers' Theatre will be used when we do not have a minister or lay pastor to fill the pulpit.

Some items in the budget for the Worship Team have been changed. Rick Herbster will submit a revised budget for 2024.

The outdoor electronic sign needs to be powered off until we receive the part needed for repair.

February 11, 2024, is Camp and Retreat Sunday. We will ask the Krislund director to come and speak on that day.

There was discussion about continuing the use of the Luke version of the *Lord's Prayer* and the Ecumenical version of the *Apostle's Creed*. Two motions were passed to keep these two versions.

Old Business: Session approved the 2023 Mission Study and gave a mandate to the PNC to meet on Thursday, October 5, for the purpose of finding a full-time called and installed pastor for Providence Presbyterian Church. The experience level for the new pastor was left up to the discretion of the PNC. The Session agreed that Bob Hollingsworth is to create an email address for the PNC.

A contact person will be needed while the church is without a full-time pastor. This would be a person that members of the congregation could reach out to in the event of an emergency or some personal need. [Since this request was made, Rick Herbster has agreed to fill this role.—Ed.]

New Business: A letter was delivered to the Session regarding the request for a same-sex marriage to take place at the church. After a discussion on the topic, Session agreed to continue following the previous decision to not allow having same-sex marriages take place at Providence.

A Word from the Worship Committee

The Worship Committee has been asked why we are now doing the Ecumenical version of the Lord's Prayer and the Apostles' Creed during our worship service, and we wanted to share why we chose these versions for worship. We hope that this explains why these changes were made. We believe that it is important that we work together as we enter a new phase of searching for a pastor and focusing on the future.
