JUNE 2024

(Note: The following highlights are taken from the minutes of the Monday, May 20, 2024, regular Session meeting.)

Clerk's Report: Communion was served to 71 communicants on Sunday, May 5.

Pastor Nominating Committee Report: The PNC is continuing to interview candidates.

Treasurer's Report: The treasurer's report was distributed and discussed.

Huntingdon Presbytery Report: The June meeting will be held at the Lewistown Presbyterian Church, but the date is not yet known. Geoff Geesey may attend this meeting as our Session representative if he is available once the date has been set.

Nominating Committee Report: The team has set a date for their first meeting: Sunday, June 9, at the church.

Session Team Reports (Chair)

Finance & Stewardship (Sue Whitsel): The Finance & Stewardship team has submitted terms of call so that the Pastor Nominating Committee will have them available when needed. The terms were approved by Session.

Per Capita for 2024 has been established at \$39.24 per person, and based on 134 members, our per capita bill from Huntingdon Presbytery will be \$5,258.00, which we pay in four installments of \$1,314.50.

For the period ending on April 30, 2024, there was \$3,361.82 given to our per capita fund. This represents a 64 percent (64%) response, or approximately 86 of our 134 members.

As noted in last month's report, our church will be working with KLW Enterprises in Illinois, who will provide stewardship materials for the 2025 campaign. The theme of the campaign is "Moving Forward by Faith." The materials and the invoice for same will be sent to the church in late August.

Congregational Care (Gail Irwin): Judy Hartzell is collecting coupons which will be mailed to the Yokosuka Naval Base at the end of June.

The schedules for May and June were completed for Cards/Flowers/Transportation.

Our date to supply cakes to the Presbyterian Village at Hollidaysburg was changed from May to June. Charyl Gardner will organize this project with the members of our congregation who are involved.

A new schedule for home communion was devised based on guidance from Session and our moderator.

Snack boxes that were mailed/delivered in April to five college students were well received. Some of the recipients sent thank-you notes to the team.

Congregational Fellowship (Glenn Nelson): Here are some upcoming events:

There will not be a coffee fellowship for the months of July and August.

Mission (Judy Hartzell): The Mission team continues to discuss the Shared Altoona Churches Meal ideas. Session approved the idea of sending letters to see if other churches would like to do something similar. Betsy Gallace and Barb Weigley brought a list of ideas, along with the history of the Hollidaysburg meals. They also shared a review of our own Soup of Saturday beginnings. Discussion revolved around a list of churches within a limited radius. The team will work together to create a letter which will explain our ideas and ask these churches if they would like to work with us and other churches to get something set up for a Saturday soup lunch on alternate Saturdays. We hope to have our letter ready by the next meeting, if not sooner.

The Pentecost offering ends on the Day of Pentecost, which is Sunday, May 19. The 40% that our church keeps will go toward Krislund tuition for neighborhood kids.

We will distribute "Free Food Pantry Lists" in June, September and December. Jane Falco reported that Pantry participation continues to grow in both donations and use.

The Worship team sent us a memo regarding our possible participation in the support of the "Inspirations" radio program. We discussed the idea and tabled further discussion until the fall.

Our team decided to allow Soup on Saturday takeouts only when requested and pre-certified. We also talked about the need to hold strictly to serving times and the offering of seconds. SOS is

planning for 50 guests on May 18, and will serve soups, hot dogs, fruit cups and donated desserts plus beverages. On June 15, SOS is planning to serve soup, sloppy joes, fruit, desserts and beverages.

The June 2024 Giving Report: Presbytery Partnership Fund - \$300; Breezewood Truck Stop - \$300; Families United for Change - \$200; Gloria Gates Foundation - \$400; Meals on Wheels - \$400.

Community Donations: For June, please donate your choice of canned fruit for the Altoona Food Bank. For the Providence Food Pantry, please donate any nonperishable food items and personal care items. No glass containers, please.

Our next meeting date will be changed from Tuesday, June 11, to Tuesday, June 4.

Outreach (Jane Yerty): The Yard Sale was held on Saturday, May 4. We were overwhelmed with the generous participation from our church family, both in items donated and help to prepare and work the day of the sale. We made over \$1,800 to provide scholarships for neighborhood children to attend Camp Krislund. The Outreach team is very thankful for everyone's assistance and support.

Thanks to the Yard Sale, we were able to sell the large, heavy tables that were difficult to handle and store.

Burchfield Landscaping will start work on the garden as soon as the weather permits. Plans are to kill the grass and replace it with mulch to help keep the area more maintenance free. The Outreach team would like to gratefully acknowledge the generous gift of donated labor from Jimmy Burchfield and company. The library is now open in the garden. A new bulletin board will be installed in the garden after removing the current one from the fence.

Session approved allocating monies not used from the Yard Sale and the 2024 Pentecost offering to a scholarship fund to be used next year for nonmembers tuition to Camp Krislund. This procedure will be reviewed every year.

Property (Geoff Geesey): Our fire alarm panel has been fixed. We are waiting for a start date on the stained glass repairs. A free-standing bulletin board has been installed in the garden area.

Spiritual Enhancement (Jeanie Mollica): The position description for Nursery Supervisor has been created and reviewed by the Session. It was suggested that the hours be changed to "7:00 am to 12:00 pm" as discussed at our April meeting. The cleaning specifications need to be outlined.

Worship (Rick Herbster): Acolytes, liturgists and ushers are in place for May.

Holy Humor Sunday on May 5 went well.

We need to replace the pulpit microphone. Prices on various models have been received and are being reviewed.

We will start "Family Liturgists" in June. A sign-up calendar will be made and distributed. Liturgists will not be needed on Sunday, June 9, since that is Youth Sunday.

Our team discussed a "Readers' Theater" program and decided to perform it with the youth.

For Mother's Day and Father's Day we will donate \$50 to Family Services.
