Session Highlights

(Note: The following highlights are taken from the minutes of the Monday, June 17, 2024, regular Session meeting.)

Clerk's Report: Sixty communicants were served communion on Sunday, June 9.

Pastor Nominating Committee Report: The PNC has met with the Rev. Dr. Hilary Livingston at a neutral pulpit and then voted to invite her to Providence Presbyterian Church to candidate. Two members of Huntingdon Presbytery's Committee on Ministry will meet with her, and if the way be clear, she will speak at our July 7 worship service. Following the worship service, we will have a congregational meeting for the purpose of voting to accept her as our pastor. We will announce this meeting at the June 23 and June 30 worship services.

There will be a meet and greet on the afternoon of Saturday, July 6, at our church's Fellowship Hall. Members and friends will have an ample opportunity to meet Pastor Livingston in a relaxed setting.

Treasurer's Report: The treasurer's report was distributed and discussed.

Huntingdon Presbytery Report: The next regular

meeting of Huntingdon Presbytery will be on Tuesday, June 18, at the Lewistown Presbyterian Church.

Nominating Committee: The committee met and has found two candidates who have agreed to be on Session. They are continuing to search for a third and final candidate for Session.

Session Team Reports (Chair)

Finance & Stewardship (Sue Whitsel): The Finance and Stewardship committee met on Thursday, June 13, to discuss the preparation of the 2025 budget. This included the creation of budget worksheets for the individual Session committees. It is anticipated that a draft copy of the 2025 budget will be available for Session review by October of this year. Session committees will be asked to develop budget figures sometime in the late summer/early fall of 2024.

For the period ending through May 30, 2024, there was \$3,597.82 given to our per capita fund. This represents a 68 percent (68%) response, or approximately 92 of our 134 members.

Congregational Care (Gail Irwin): Judy Hartzell is collecting the coupons which will be mailed to the Yokosuka Naval Base at the end of June. Judy said

that it would be helpful if the coupons were separated into two categories, one for food and one for non-food items, before dropping the coupons in the collection box. The coupons can be clipped together or placed into baggies. Also, coupons that are marked to expire in the US market have another six month of life overseas.

The schedules for June and July were completed for cards/flowers/transportation.

Charyl Gardner has organized the delivery of homemade cakes to the Presbyterian Village at Hollidaysburg for Friday, June 28.

Following guidance from Session, our team visited and delivered communion to seven home-bound congregants.

Birthday cards, get-well cards, and missing-you cards were prepared by team members for June and July. Names for the congregation card shower were designated.

Judy reported that Session announced that prayer requests that come into the church office will be shared with the congregation instead of just the Congregational Care committee.

Congregational Fellowship (Glenn Nelson): Our cost for the picnic dinner is \$13.75; we will offer it to the congregation for \$10.00. Our cost for the all-day ride pass is \$26.00; the congregation will pay \$15.00. Steve Parsons will have Kimberly post a sign up sheet on Sunday, June 16. The last day to sign up and pay is Sunday, July 14.

Mission (Judy Hartzell): We added two more Krislund campers, which makes a final total of four campers to be sent by the Mission committee.

Barb Weigley composed a sample letter for the Shared Altoona Churches Meal idea. Betsy Gallace will input the letter as written and send it to the entire team to hold for revisions. She will also send a draft copy to the 28th Street Church of the Brethren for their input. Hopefully, a joint meeting with other willing churches will follow.

We will distribute "Free Food Pantry List" reminders in June.

We are planning for 64 guests at the June Soup on Saturday, and will serve soups and meatball

sandwiches, fruit cups, desserts and beverages. The Soup on Saturday event for July 20, will include soup, ham salad sandwiches, watermelon, desserts and beverages.

As part of our mission support for the month of June, we gave the following: Krislund Program Staff - \$300; Altoona Food Bank - \$300; Krislund Capital Campaign - \$700; The Healing Patch - \$250; Krislund Scholarships - \$1,680.

For the Altoona Food Bank in July, we are asking for donations of peanut butter and jelly. The Providence Food Pantry is asking for donations of any non-perishable food items and personal care items. No glass containers, please.

It costs money to pick up the picnic tables that are made from recycled bottle caps. Session asked the Mission team to explore funding for this.

The Visioning Team of Huntingdon Presbytery is developing a church mission process that congregations in our presbytery could use to explore new ways to reach out to their local communities.

Providence has received a grant from the Hunger Program for our Food Pantry. We will apply again for another such grant.

Outreach (Jane Yerty): Krislund campers and parents met on Sunday, June 9. Five non-member kids and four church member kids will attend camp this summer. A Krislund Camp Scholarship Fund was approved and will be available throughout the year for donations.

Work in our community garden is progressing with Burchfield Landscaping. Geoff Geesey and his helpers have installed a new bulletin board. Many gardens have already been planted.

The Community Library is open and in use.

Our team is planning to do a fall Card making event for distribution on Veterans Day.

We are also planning a Clothing Giveaway for Saturday, August 10. Donations of gently used clothing for children, teens and adults are needed. Also being considered is a shoe giveaway. We will need the week prior to the giveaway for preparation.

Personnel (Bob Hollingsworth): The nursery position has not yet been filled. We will repost this position on Facebook.

Property (Geoff Geesey): The small stained glass windows in our sanctuary will be repaired soon. Our team will soon get bids for carpet cleaning in the sanctuary.

Spiritual Enhancement (Jeanie Mollica): We had a successful Youth Sunday on June 9—all the youth participated in this service.

On Friday, July 26, the church is going to Sight and Sound Theater to see Daniel. We will be paying for seven youth to attend.

For our Vacation Bible School this year, we will be asking the congregation for monetary donations instead of snacks as we will be providing a dinner.

The Pre-Kindergarten class would like to redecorate their classroom.

Worship (Rick Herbster): Acolytes and ushers are in place for June. Family liturgists are working on the calendar in Fellowship Hall.

We received and installed a new pulpit microphone—it sounds great!

Communion and offertory procedures will stay the same throughout the summer. Rick will place an announcement on the screens and in the bulletin for special music during the summer. Ellie will get the summer fans out of the storage closet.

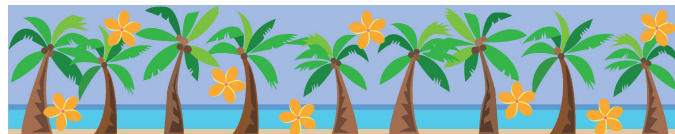

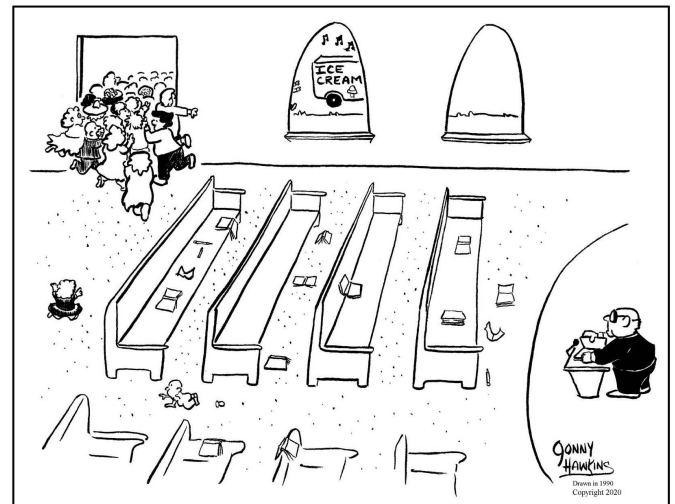
