(Note: The following highlights are taken from the minutes of the Monday, December 15, 2025, regular Session meeting.)

**Clerk's Report:** Seventy-seven communicants received communion on Sunday, December 7.

**Treasurer's Report:** The treasurer's report was reviewed and discussed.

**Moderator's Report:** Pastor Hilary listed all her activities for the past month.

Our pastor will be taking five days vacation and two days study leave from Monday, January 26, through Monday, February 2, 2026. We will need to fill the pulpit on Sunday, February 1, 2026. She plans to do ministry-related reading during her study leave.

#### Session Team Reports (Chair)

Finance & Stewardship (Sue Whitsel): Per capita for 2025 has been established at \$41.00 per member, and based on 140 members, our total per capita bill from Huntingdon Presbytery will be \$5,740.00. For the period ending on November 30, 2025, there was \$3,821.00 paid into the per capita fund. This represents a 67 percent (67%) response, or approximately 93 of our 140 members.

The per capita rate for 2026 will remain the same as it was for 2025: \$41.00 per individual member of the church. That breaks down to \$27.76 for the Presbytery, \$2.40 for the Synod of the Trinity, and \$10.84 for the General Assembly. Based on our membership of 135 as of 12/31/2024, our annual per capita bill will be \$5,535.00, which is payable in four quarterly installments of \$1,383.75.

The 2026 budget was approved by Session at the

November meeting. This budget was presented to the congregation at our annual meeting on Sunday, November 16, 2025, and the terms of call for Pastor Livingston were reviewed. A motion was approved to receive the budget and approve the new terms of call.

Congregational Care (Gail Irwin): The team assisted Pastor Hilary by delivering November communion to homebound members. They also delivered Advent dinners and cookie trays to our homebound members as well as Christmas gifts to the Presbyterian Village at Hollidaysburg.

Congregational Fellowship (Amanda Yeager): Our Advent Dinner on Sunday, December 7, went well and \$270 was donated toward the meal.

Spiritual Enhancement (Heather Wisor): The youth went shopping with money collected during Vacation Bible School and donations from the congregation. The money was used to purchase groceries used to fill 100 meal bags. All 100 bags were distributed at the North Pole Giveaway on Saturday, December 13.

In January 2026, the youth will be creating birthday boxes. Each box will include cake mix, icing, candles, sprite and a pan. Megan Burchfield and the youth will be asking for donations from the congregation to help support this effort which will benefit people in need in the community.

**Worship (Rick Herbster):** Acolytes, liturgists and ushers are set for December.

The Presbytery Pastoral Worship Lunch that was supposed to be held at our church on Tuesday, December 2, was cancelled due to weather. On that note, we discussed our Winter Weather

Service cancellation process. Barb Hazlett will get the email list from Kimberly so that she can email all members that have current email addresses. Rick and Ellie Herbster will check the directory to see who does not have an email address. Rick will make an announcement to the congregation regarding ways to check for a church service cancellation (email, website and Facebook).

Steve and Carole Parsons will pick up the poinsettias on Tuesday, December 23, with help from Dave Brownell, as we ordered 63.

We discussed groups that will do the readings and light the candles for Advent Sundays.

The dates for communion in 2026 are: January 4, February 1, March 1, April 2 (Maundy Thursday), May 3, June 7, July 5, August 2, September 6, October 4, November 1, and December 6.

We also discussed all the aspects of the Christmas Eve service. The offering will be given to the Presbyterian Church U.S.A. Christmas Joy Offering.
